> Older people are the focus of organizers, and also of the coolest actuality: older people (or seniors, old, retired, papy-boomers, ...) are raising big questions to our society. Demography shows them as a challenge, an economical sector, a reflect of ourselves, a historical unknown situation... There are too many facets to mention...

At the same time, technologies have evolved as never in these last few years and now play a major part in our social and professional lives to the point that a non internet user becomes almost an "under-citizen".
