The University of Dublin will organize a conference on active ageing on Monday 2nd and 3rd of November.

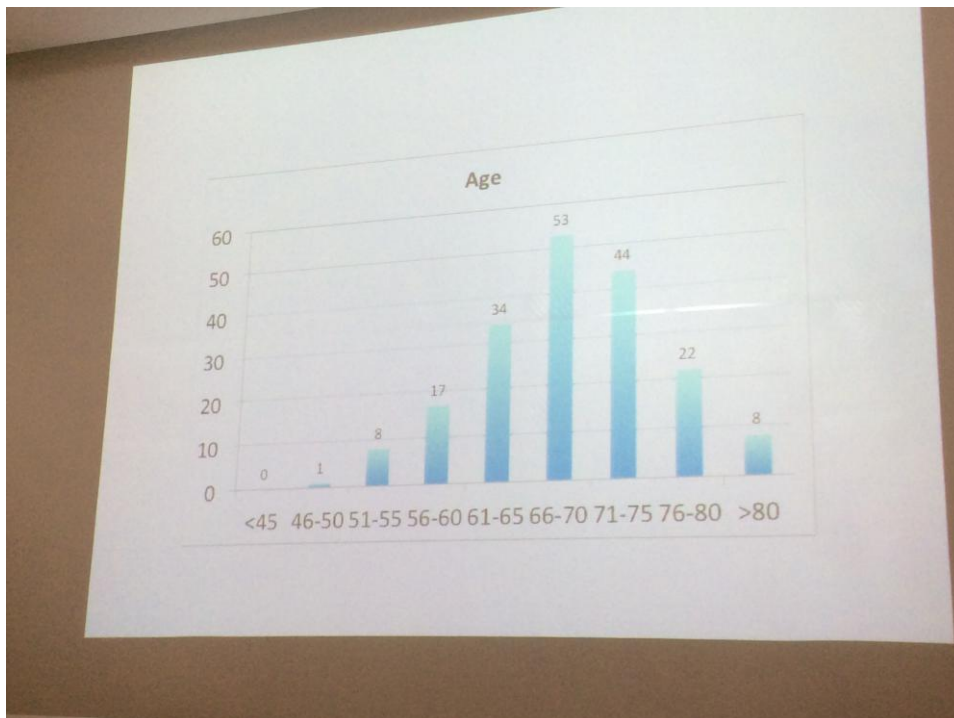
Anne-Marie sent the presentation of the conference in Dublin.

O1 - User needs analysis

Results of the report



52% female / 48% male

Almost 90% can access Internet independently.

Lot of seniors are afraid of security and data treatment, that has consequences on the participation in social media. But after a while they overcome this obstacle.

Barriers for ICT adoption or ICT experience

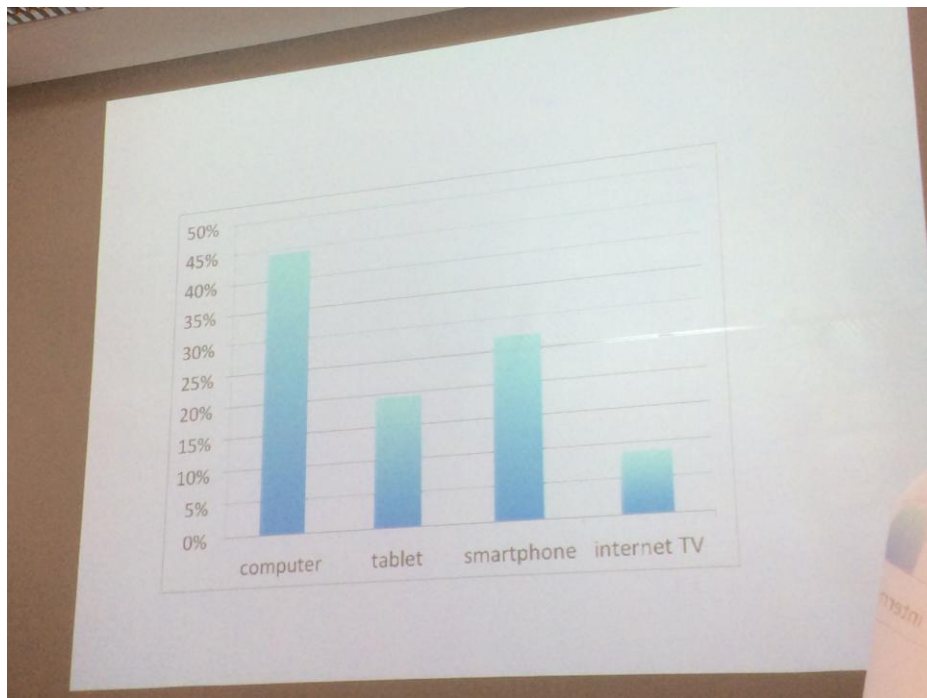
- Loss of control: security and privacy
- Psychological: frustration stress
- Physical vision: problems keyboard
- Use: difficulties on certain topics
- Too complex: windows or websites

Online learning experience

- Good experience in general (or no experience)
- Bad experience: difficult to ask, too much time demanding, technical difficulties that can't be overcome
- General answer: "it depends »

How should online courses be provided? Suggestions by seniors

- Interactive (best answer)
- Simply instructions
- Not too much text
- Through tutors (not teachers!)
- Lot of networking between participants
- Virtual teacher but with visual contact



- More freedom

Difficulties in online learning

- Working in groups
- "Can I learn the same as in face-to-face classes?"
- Easy to be lost
- Difficulties in finding good tools , organization (forums)

Preference (non ICT experience)

- Mostly seniors prefer face-to-face learning
- Less than 10 seniors prefer online learning
- Even learners from rural areas prefer face-to-face learning, even if they won't move to the city to follow the classes

Ideas about how to organize e-learning courses: we might organize a normal face-to-face course to show seniors how to e-learn through the platform.

O2 - Pedagogical concept

Anna proposed to implement a intergenerational approach in the e-learning platform. We could make some texts and videos and try them during the pilot phase.

Anna will send the report and we will give feedback.

After pilot courses we will send to participants an online questionnaire to evaluate the contents and organization.

O3 - E-Learning platform

Overall view of the platform (still in German) by Anne-Marie.

E-learning platform:

- The learning platform has to be in each language
- Translation of the main parts in French

O4 - First Online course prototype (June - Nov. 2015)

Each partner will develop a learning unit for the pilot course (pilot tests will only in Germany and Spain). Each learning unit will have sub-topics

Timetable

- The coordinator will provide us an Authoring Guidelines by mid of June. Partners will provide feedback by the end of June.
- Prototype learning unit will be ready by the end of July.
- 5-8 further units by October (2 each partner).
- Feedback until middle of November, final version end of November
- Localization process starting in Nov/Dec
- Pretesting in Dec/Jan
- Piloting from March 2016 in DE and ES

Each country will have to involve 150 participants for the 3 courses, so 50 participants per course.

Learning Units

- Task oriented: you would like to.. (We tell a story and support the handling of the task)
- Introduce the topics: in this unit we will learn
- Didactical elements: texts, pics, videos, exercises, etc.
- Evaluation: units questionnaires
- Development of the units ILI and all partners
- Localisation (word doc) partners

Content/ Curriculum I

- Course theme: working with computers and Internet
- Previous knowledge? Very little knowledge/ experience with digital devices vs basic knowledge, or basic courses vs advanced course

Content / Curriculum II

Basic course

- My virtual classroom -> ILI
- Writing on the PC -> DCU (ESE)
- Surfing on the Web -> DCU, UJI (Palmenia)
- Electronical letters: e-mail -> ESE (Palmenia)
- How to organize and structure the computer (data management) -> Palmenia (UJI)
- Online services (i.e. Online shopping)
- Computer based learning

Advanced courses

- Com. on the Internet, forums -> UJI (DCU)
- Com. on the Internet, Skype -> ESE (Palmenia)
