TURKEY, 7-10 NOVEMBER 2014

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The third international meeting was held in Turgutlu, Turkey, from 7-th to 10-th November, 2013. The host institution was Turgutlu Adult Education Centre.

8th November:

In the afternoon, the project team visited Turgutlu Adult Education Centre. They got involved in different activities with the trainers. They worked on the art of ebru, ceramics, embroidering with silk, needlework and the art of kat-ı.



After the work in the centre is completed the tea visited the workshop of a master who produces handmade shoes. He is the only person left in the town doing this work and the team was very interested in watching him work.



9th November:

In the morning, the team continued working on the project.

This time it was more about the planning of the upcoming activities.

After lunch, there was a trip to a village nearby. The partners observed the traditional way of living here. The villagers offered the Grundtvig team traditional food and the partner seven had the chance to cook with them.

There was also an exhibition here which exhibits the traditional objects used in villages.

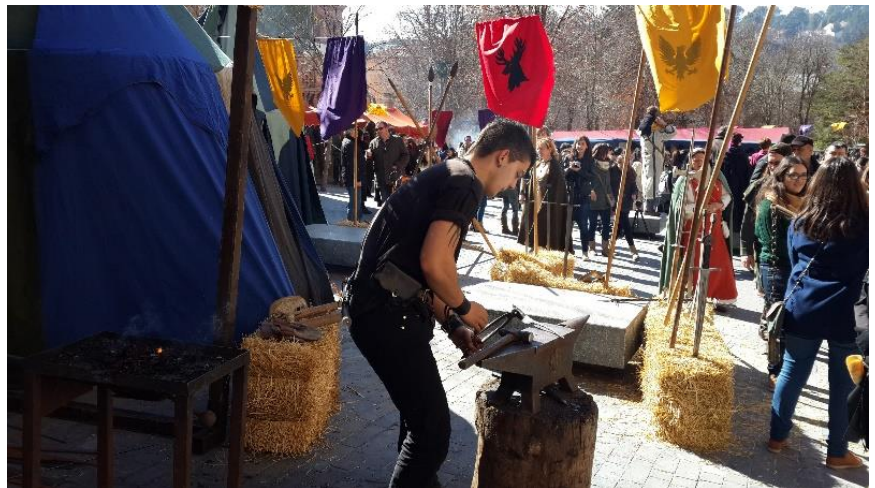
22th February:
