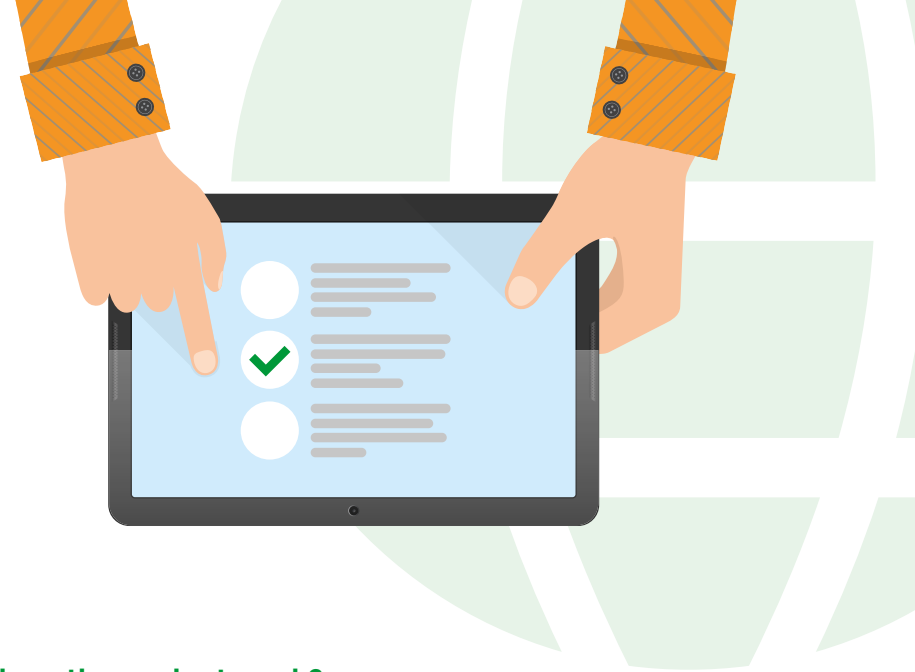
## What is the iDemocracy project?

The iDemocracy Project is a European Union Project that will last until October 2022.

The aim of the project is to improve the competences of people with intellectual disabilities and their supporters in the exercise of their participation, representation and voting rights in their associations, in the community and at the political level.

The organisations participating in the project will create a training programme and a digital tool.

The project involves 6 organisations in Europe.



## How does the project work?

Among all participating organisations, we will create training materials so that people with intellectual disabilities together with their supporters improve their level of participation in different spaces and learn digital skills.

These materials will be adapted for people with intellectual disabilities.

With this project we will work on citizen participation.

In addition, we will create a digital tool to carry out the training.

The tool will enable us to increase the digital skills of people with intellectual disabilities.
