

Third partners meeting in Rzeszów

The consortium of the RESET project has met for the third time. The meeting was held in Rzeszów, Poland and lasted two days - from 8th to 9th of October. The meeting was hosted by Polish partner INNEO and chaired by French coordinator E-SENIORS. The representatives of all partnering organisations were present at the event. Following the usual schedule the general introductions and greetings were followed by a short review of the project outputs, objectives and progress. Partners have participated in detailed discussions on the latest activities and future development of the project. RESET is now entering an important phase when all the learning resources are going to be developed. For this reason partners made a lot of effort to ensure that everyone is familiar with their tasks and responsibilities. Project partners analysed contents of learning resources and agreed on the division of up-coming tasks. In order to provide a highest quality of the final resources for older workers and their educators, partners analysed the risks of cooperation and developed the strategies that aim to overcome them. Partners discussed also the dissemination activities and the progress of the work in all project outputs. To summarise the two-day work, the action plan and schedule for next months has been agreed.



Where are we now with RESET?

The RESET project has been ongoing already for a year. During this time period partners intensively worked in order to perform research analysis and develop the frameworks and structures of the Intellectual Outputs that will now serve as a base in learning material development process. Learning frameworks have been designed based on the results of Local Training Analysis performed by partner organisations in order to ensure the outputs respond directly to the needs of a target groups.

IO1: A bespoke, training programme for older workers

Partners are working to develop modular curriculum to support older workers remain active in the workforce. The curriculum will include competences empowering workers to become proficient social researchers. The curriculum will include following areas: Interaction and Communication, Analytical skills, Organisational competences and Conducting social research.

IO2: A Digital Competence Toolkit

RESET partners began a production of a suite of training resources addressing specific digital skills of older workers as social researchers. These resources will develop the digital skills of future researchers in the area of desk based research in online environment, online communication, project management, time management, teamworking, data processing and presentation, document writing and conducting a survey.



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IO3: Training Programme and Handbook for adult educators

The third output is addressed to adult education professionals. It aims to introduce them to the IO1 and IO2 curriculums and provide necessary skills to facilitate the teaching. The training programme will also introduce adult educators to the e-learning environment including online security and business canvas.

IO4: Business Development and Planning Framework for older workers

In order to support transition of older workers from employment to part-time self-employment partners are developing a bespoke learning framework supported by a full suite of tools and resources. These learning materials concentrate on bespoke business planning and development skills as well as country specific regulations and opportunities for setting-up a company by an older person.

IO5: E-learning portal

All the resources and material that will be produced in the framework of RESET project will be available for all interested parties through RESET e-learning platform. Partners are now developing the platform that will work in the form of one-stop-shop in order to guarantee an open and instant access to learning resources for all interested sites.



Training in Paris

The training event for adult educators will be organised in **Paris, France from 18th to 22nd of February 2019**. Each partner will send three adult educators to the week-long training. Partners will conduct an international piloting of the developed resources in order to demonstrate their application in adult workers education. The event aims also to celebrate working in older years and to demonstrate options to extend older workers career in the field of social research. It will also be a great opportunity for international integration, best practice exchange and cultural enrichment for the participants.
